

Quality Assured Care Learning Service selfassessment









The Quality Standards are a bespoke measure of quality learning and development for the adult social care workforce. They are designed to set a benchmark for quality training delivery and support employers to make informed choices.

To become quality assured, training providers will have to provide evidence which meets the Quality Standards designed for all training providers delivering to the adult social care sector as well as providing evidence for the Quality Standards related to specific accredited qualification(s) and/or learning programmes.
